NOTICE OF FEE CHANGES

Effective January 1, 2010

Per Assembly Bill 2193 (Stats. 2008, ch. 231), the following fees will be effective as of January 1, 2010:

Fees Associated with Out-of-State Discovery Procedures.

- \$30 fee authorized by Code of Civil Procedure 2029.300 for application for subpoena for discovery in out-of-state case
- \$355 fee authorized by Code of Civil Procedure 2029. 610(a), 2029.620(c)(1) for first petition by party for relief in discovery dispute related to out-of-state case
- \$80 fee authorized by Code of Civil Procedure 2029.610(a), 2029.620(c)(2) for first petition by non-party for relief in discovery dispute related to out-of-state case
- \$40 fee authorized by Code of Civil Procedure 2029.620(c)(1) for subsequent petition by party for relief in discovery dispute related to out-of-state case (where first appearance fee was previously paid)
- \$40 fee authorized by Code of Civil Procedure 2029.620(c)(2) for subsequent petition by nonparty for relief in discovery dispute related to out-of-state case (where fee under GC 70626(c) was previously paid)
- \$355 fee authorized by Code of Civil Procedure 2029.610(c) for response by party to petition for relief in discovery dispute related to out-of-state case (where first appearance fee was not previously paid)

Additionally, per Assembly Bill 131 (Stats. 2009, ch. 413):

 Welfare and Institutions Code 903.1 authorizes the reimbursement of costs incurred for legal services rendered for a parent, guardian or minor by public defender, other public attorney, or an attorney in private practice appointed pursuant to an order of the juvenile court. As per the bill, the Judicial Council will establish a cost recovery program for counsel appointed by the courts, and the Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) will provide that information at a later date.
