3. Local Rule 4.41 (b) allows a commission in the sale of personal property in the amount of five percent (5%) of the sales price.

4. Pursuant to my discussions with CAROLE ROBBINS, Supervising Deputy Public Guardian, there are approximately five to ten mobile home sales per year that occur in conservatorship proceedings in which the Public Guardian in and for the County of San Mateo acts as conservator.

CAROLE ROBBINS has indicated to me that she is unable to contract for the sale of any 5. mobile homes with the current five percent (5%) listing and that all of the dealers have insisted on a minimum sales commission of ten percent (10%) of the sales price. STANDING ORDER 97-18 6. CAROLE ROBBINS has further indicated that the Public Guardian in the past had attempted to sell one mobile home by way of a public auction which was attended by only one bidder. This proved to be a totally deficient way in selling mobile homes and therefore this request for a standing order relating only to mobile homes is made asking the Court for permission to enter into an exclusive contract for the sale of mobile homes calling for a commission of ten percent (10%) payable to the selling entity.
